Major Terminal Expansion Planned

As the Tri-Cities Airport continues to grow, a four-phase, \$139 million plan is underway to expand the terminal.

"We knew we would need to address the front half of the terminal at some point. That point is now, as our increasing passenger loads and bigger aircraft are putting pressure on the front half of the terminal," said Buck Taft, Airport Director. "This budget also addresses the need to add more gates and sets the airport up well for the future."

Dear Valued Travelers,

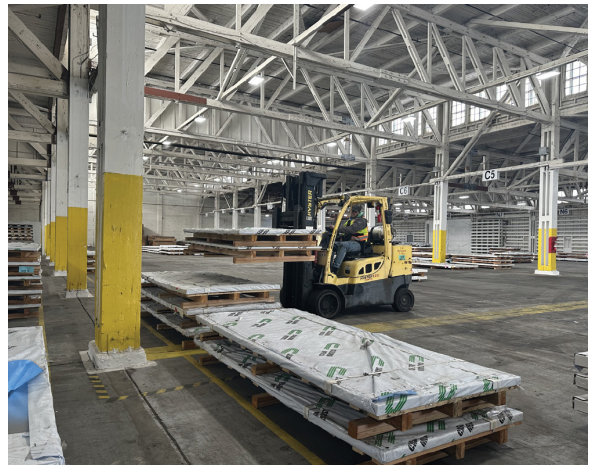
