### **Recent Route Changes at Tri-Cities Airport**

Pasco, WA – There have been several route changes at Tri-Cities Airport recently: daily nonstop service between Tri-Cities Airport (PSC) and Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) will cease operations on January 5, 2020. Nonstop service between PSC and Chicago O’Hare International Airport (ORD) will begin June 4, 2020.

The revisions come as the airport heads toward completion of its busiest year ever. PSC is tracking to end the year having served nearly 900,000 passengers—12 percent above 2018, which is the airport’s current busiest year on record. The airport has nonstop connections to Denver, Las Vegas, Minneapolis-St. Paul, Phoenix-Mesa, San Francisco, Seattle, Salt Lake City, and seasonal service to Los Angeles.

“Our flights across the country continue to shift with the region’s demand,” said Buck Taft, Tri-Cities airport director. “As more travelers fly through PSC, we hope they will continue to use our current offerings and also embrace the nonstop flight to Chicago and its easy connections to the East Coast.”
